Admission Criteria

Freshmen:

- Course of Study
 - 4 units of College Prep (CP) English
 - 3 units of CP Mathematics (minimally including Algebra I, II, and Geometry)
 - 3 units of CP Science (Biology, Chemistry and Physics recommended)
 - 3 units of CP Social Studies
 - 4 units of CP Electives
 - 5 units of Other Electives
- Cumulative High School Grade Point Average: 2.80 minimum
- SAT: 510 Critical Reading, 510 Math, 510 Writing or ACT: 22 English, 22 Math, 22 English / Writing and 22 Composite (minimum)
- Rank: Top 40% of graduating class

Transfer Students:

- Minimum of 24 transferable semester college credits:
- Cumulative College Grade Point Average: 2.50 non-resident / 2.00 resident

Selected programs have higher admission requirements.

Fall Application:

- Priority date: January 4
Final deadline: May 3

Spring Application:

- Priority date: September 1
Final deadline: October 1

(International students must meet priority dates to be considered for admission)
